## ARTISTIC DIRECTOR'S WELCOME



Hello and welcome to the Ryedale Festival 2022 - a season of inspiring performances in beautiful and historic locations across North Yorkshire.

Artists in residence include Roderick Williams, the Maxwell Quartet, The Gesualdo Six, National Youth Choir and Philharmonia Baroque. The programme mingles legendary performers like Dame Janet Baker with stars of the new generation such as the Kanneh-Masons. Internationally renowned soloists and chamber musicians can be heard in intimate surroundings and a friendly atmosphere. Sir Mark Elder conducts Verdi at York Minster. And concerts in famous and spectacular venues are balanced with daytime recitals in some of Ryedale's quietest and most beautiful corners.

The festival finds a special place for the music of Handel, including a pop-up production of his magical little opera *Acis and Galatea* that will visit three of the region's most beautiful and ancient churches. Also in focus: the music and legacy of

Vaughan Williams in his 150th anniversary year, the genre-blending brilliance of Errollyn Wallen, and the 50th birthday of Swedish supergroup ABBA.

Among six world premieres, Joseph Howard's community song cycle *Seven Mercies* celebrates the heritage and local talent of Pickering, *Looking West* by Julian Philips is inspired by the ancient stories and landscapes of northern England, and Roxanna Panufnik's *Babylonia* goes on an imaginative journey to the Middle East.

Literary events include a visit from the poet and author Lemn Sissay. Family concerts include a musical version of the modern children's classic *Izzy Gizmo*. Also in the festival collage: jazz, folk, talks, masterclasses, a Dementia-friendly concert, a 'Troubadour Trail', late-night candlelit concerts, one of Yorkshire's best brass bands, and an invitation to *Come and Sing*.

To our loyal audience members who return year after year, thank you for your continued support. To those who are new to the festival, or to classical music, we look forward to welcoming you. First-time ticket-buyers can come to selected events for only £10. Under 18s for only £5. And all are invited to enjoy the additional content that will be shared on our digital platform *RyeStream*, which offers a window on the festival, another way to engage.

As Vaughan Williams knew, music and place can enhance each other. Thank you to all the generous supporters, donors and volunteers who help make that true in Ryedale. Read on to discover more about the programme. I look forward to seeing you there and hope you find lots to inspire and uplift you in the festival.

His sister Isata won the Leonard Bernstein prize in 2021 and has released two chart-topping solo albums. And collectively the family delighted millions with their livestreamed performances during lockdown, a project captured by a recent BBC *Imagine* documentary.
